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Proposition No. 1**City of Pasco****Reduction of City Limits**

A citizens' petition was filed with the Franklin County Auditor for placement on the ballot, concerning the reduction of the size of the City of Pasco. The petition describes two areas which are sought for removal from the city limits. First is an area of about 41 acres and 41 in population, in the vicinity of Road 76 and Court Street, annexed to Pasco in 2009. Second is an area of about 608 acres and 1,450 population, generally lying between Road 52 and Road 68, south of the FCID canal and north of Sylvester Street, annexed to Pasco in 2012.

Explanatory Statement

This proposition is in response to a petition seeking reduction of the City with the removal of two areas from the Pasco City limits. If approved, approximately 649 acres plus approximately 1491 population, currently in the City, would be removed. One area is about 41 acres with a population of approximately 41, in the vicinity of Road 76 and Court Street, annexed to Pasco in 2009. Another is about 608 acres and 1450 population, generally lying between Road 52 and Road 68, south of the FCID canal and north of Sylvester Street, annexed to Pasco in 2012.

Statement For Proposition No. 1

Pasco's City Administration has long ignored the wishes of its residents. The City persistently forces residents and business to live and operate in an environment driven by the personal vision and profit of a few business and city leaders. For decades, Pasco barred citizens from significantly directing city actions. Anyone obtaining a building permit, driving on the congested roads, suffering from high density neighborhoods, walked a dog in the park, or attempted to find a sympathetic ear at City Hall understands how the City's Administration dominates residents.

We don't live in a country where governing bodies use "coercion" to impose their will or trade voting rights for life's basic necessities. After purchasing the private water system serving West Pasco, the City forced citizens to sign a "contract" exchanging their vote on annexation for water. After Pasco was unable to obtain 10% of local residents to sign the petition to annex the Chiawana area, the City manipulated the law and began self-initiating annexations without any voter involvement. Pasco bypassed the residents in 2009 and 2013, annexing 1,500 citizens against their will, requiring only the City Planner's signature. Many others who did not sign the agreements and do not use City water, are still drawn into these annexations.

Proposition 1 starts returning City control back to Pasco residents. Join the thousands of your neighbors that initiated Proposition 1, send a clear signal to City management and return control to the citizens, before the City circumvents your rights.

Rebuttal of Statement Against

Since 1990 Pasco has grown from about 20,000 to over 65,500 residents today. Furthering this rapid, irrational growth, against County residents' ardent opposition, Pasco prematurely bit chunks out of the area's remaining rural landscape not yet suitable for suburbia. Pasco Plans to add 9,000 residents to the area, crippling infrastructure expansion, escalating traffic congestion, and increasing the tax burden for ALL Pasco taxpayers.

Restore our right to choose where we live.

Statement Against Proposition No. 1

In 1992 Franklin County designated west Pasco as part of Pasco's "Urban Growth Area" under Washington's Growth Management Act. Since that designation Pasco has been extending services such as sewer and water into the area in exchange for commitments to annex from those receiving services.

In recent years portions of west Pasco have been annexed into the city and the infra-structure for sewer and water has been utilized as planned. By including west Pasco, the financial burden of serving all citizens can be shared across a larger tax base, benefitting everyone. Now comes a proposition to reverse a well planned future and a fair sharing of the cost of services.

A vote against Proposition No. 1 is a vote that will maintain lower water and sewer rates for all city residents and continue with established leash laws for dogs, and enforcement of dangerous dog requirements. A no vote will ensure greater law enforcement capacity. A no vote will preserve improved garbage service, providing all citizens of Pasco with unlimited collection. A no vote will maintain fulltime, professional fire and ambulance response 24/7 and offer reduced fire insurance premiums.

In short, public services are much better and more efficient in the city and, after all is said and done, we are all part of the same Pasco community: The same community for shopping; for schools; for parks and public facilities and services which benefit us all.

Maintain efficiency, quality and fairness of services: Please vote no on Proposition 1.

Proposition No. 2**City of Pasco****Change of Form of Government**

A citizens' petition was filed with the Franklin County Auditor for placement on the ballot, concerning a change in the form of government for the City. The petition proposes that Pasco abandon its existing Council-Manager plan of government, whereby the City is governed by the elected City Council, with daily operations supervised by a professional City Manager who is appointed and removed by the City Council, and adopt a Mayor-Council plan of government, whereby daily operations are supervised by a citizen, elected as Mayor by the voters for four-year terms and possessing veto power over Council actions.

Explanatory Statement

This proposition is in response to a petition seeking to change the form of Pasco City government. If approved, this proposition requires the City to abandon the plan of government under which it has operated since 1964, the Council-Manager plan of government, whereby the City is governed by the elected City Council, with daily operations managed by a professional City Manager, appointed and removed by the City Council, and adopt a Mayor-Council plan of government, whereby daily operations are managed by a citizen, elected as Mayor by the voters for four-year terms, and possessing veto power over Council actions.

Statement For Proposition No. 2

More than 80% of Washington cities have chosen to operate under the Mayor-Council Plan. Washington's ten largest cities with populations greater than 50,000 (the population category that includes Pasco) operate under this Mayor-Council Plan. Pasco is home to numerous well-qualified, professional residents. Many such men and women are willing, capable, and prepared to run for and carry out the responsibilities of elected Mayor.

The Mayor-Council Plan separates executive and legislative powers, providing a system of checks and balances patterned after our national and state constitutions. Proposition 2 places Pasco's executive authority, including the veto, in a Mayor, elected at large. The City Council is vested with legislative, policy-making and veto override authorities.

An elected Mayor will be directly accountable to Pasco's citizens via the ballot box. Pasco citizens will be able to judge their elected Mayor on all City actions, including: land use development; traffic congestion; public safety; cost of services; permitting; regulations; balanced budgets; and helpful, courteous, responsive City staff. When something goes wrong, Pasco's elected Mayor is accountable for their actions, and may be ousted by the voters.

Pasco's elected Mayor will provide a single point of accountability for all City Departments. An elected Mayor selects and leads qualified professional managers, to fairly and honestly conduct the City's business.

Pasco's current Manager-Council system provides a token Mayor who lacks executive authority and accountability, only presiding at meetings.

Thousands of your neighbors requested this proposition be placed on the ballot. Vote to ACCEPT Proposition 2.

Rebuttal of Statement Against

Only 18% of Washington cities still employ a City Manager. For over 30 years, Pasco's City Manager has been responsible for haphazard land use development; congested streets; burdensome regulations and permitting; and an unresponsive City Hall. Despite dissatisfaction with these poor results, Pasco citizens have no say in the City Manager's performance, pay, bonuses, or benefits. Pasco residents cannot hire, fire or demand change from their City Manager. Vote to ACCEPT an elected Mayor. AnElectedMayorForPasco@gmail.com.

Statement Against Proposition No. 2

Pasco citizens chose the current Council-Manager form of government in 1964, realizing the need for a qualified professional manager with knowledge of budgeting, labor-management, planning, and economic development as opposed to a politician with limited or no city management skills. The City Council selects the City Manager and evaluates his/her performance. The current format assures immediate accountability because the manager can be fired for failing to do a good job - no waiting four years for an election. Council-manager government encourages input into the political process, diffuses the power of special interests, and eliminates partisan politics from municipal hiring, firing, and contracting decisions. It provides direct public access to the Mayor and Council by allowing the community to voice their concerns directly through elected Council members, not through staff. It frees up the elected body to establish policy to be carried out by the manager and staff.

The proposed Council-Mayor form of government dilutes elected council member representation of their constituents by giving the Mayor veto power over ordinances passed by the majority of council members. One elected official should not be granted control over the majority.

Proponents of changing Pasco's form of government are advancing a plan to "fix a system that isn't broken". The complex operations of a city require professionalism, experience and responsiveness. Pasco has thrived with accountable, effective and efficient city government for nearly 50 years; let's keep it that way. Vote no on Proposition 2, Change of Form of Government.

Rebuttal of Statement For

Thousands of your neighbors did not request this proposition, less than 1 in 10 registered voters signed it. Large cities with the Mayor-Council Plan hire additional staff to oversee daily operations, adding one more layer of cost and bureaucracy to city government. For these and numerous other reasons, an increasing number of cities are switching to our Council-Manager form of government. Don't lose a form of government that works! Vote No on Proposition 2.

Fire Protection District No. 3
Proposition Authorizing the Restoration
of Existing Property Tax Levies

The proposition will authorize the Board of Commissioners of the District to restore its regular property tax levy to an amount not to exceed \$1.50 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation for collection in 2014 and to authorize setting a limit factor of 5% for each of the five succeeding years to fund emergency medical services. (This shall not be construed to authorize an excess levy and shall be subject to other applicable statutory limits.)

Statement For Proposition No. 1

The "Vote Yes! for FCFD#3 Ambulance Levy" committee requests Franklin County Fire District #3 voters restore the regular property tax levy rate to \$1.50. This is not a new tax, but instead does return the levy rate to its original level established decades ago. Legislated property tax limitations over the years decreased the Fire District levy rate which would have become approximately \$1.18 in the year 2014. This levy lift dedicates ambulance service funding for the Fire District. It will pay for ambulances plus their fuel and maintenance. It will pay for emergency medical technicians, paramedics, their wages, and their continued medical training. It will also pay for medical supplies. The Fire District has been providing ambulance service this year by using reserve funds. These funds are running out. If this levy lift fails, ambulance services in FCFD #3 will stop by February, 2014. Your YES vote for this levy lift is crucial. Help save someone's life...possibly your own!

Explanatory Statement

If enacted, this proposition would increase the fire protection district's levy limit to \$1.50 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation from its estimated 2014 levy of \$1.18 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation. The increased levy amount would be dedicated to the payment of expenses for maintaining, operating and equipping the fire district so it may continue to provide emergency medical service (ambulance). The authorization to maintain the \$1.50 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation would expire in six years.

The Board of Commissioners of Franklin County Fire Protection District No. 4 adopted Resolution No. 6 asking voters to increase property taxes for operations and facility improvements. This proposition would increase the District's regular property tax levy by \$0.29 per \$1,000.00 over the current levy of assessed valuation for collection beginning in 2014 and use the 2014 levy amount to recalculate subsequent levy limits.

Franklin County Fire District 4 commissioners have passed Resolution No. 2013-6 to place a levy increase on the November 2013 ballot. Approval of this levy will allow FCFD#4 to maintain its current level of fire protection services for the residents of Fire District 4.

The committee for approval of the Franklin County Fire District 4 levy concurs with the commissioners and FCFD 4 personnel that passage of Proposition 1 is vital for continued operations at the present level of service and to insure an acceptable level of service for the future. The need exists for increased funding to replace outdated and inoperable equipment; replace the Hendricks Fire Station, and maintain a high degree of training and firefighting gear for the volunteers. Cost increases in all phases of fire suppression equipment make it difficult to continue at an acceptable level of safety for volunteers and the residents of Franklin County Fire District 4 at the current rate.

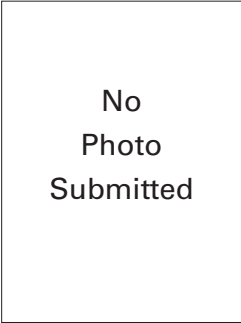

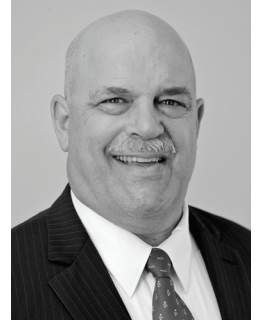

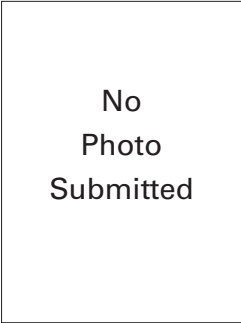

I would be honored to put my years of private business and government finance experience to work for you at the Port of Pasco.

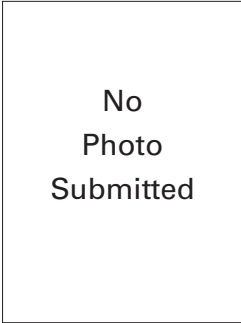
